**MINUTES OF THE 63<sup>rd</sup> ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**  
**Held on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2024 at 6:00 PM**  
**Venue : Hotel Red Fox, Bhiwadi**

The 63<sup>rd</sup> Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Indian Institute of Materials Management (IIMM) was convened on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2024 at 6:00 PM at Hotel Red Fox, Bhiwadi, after confirmation of quorum, meeting was declared open.

The meeting was presided over by National President Mr. Lalit Raj Meena, who welcomed all members present.

**1. Confirmation of Receipt of Annual Report**

The National President confirmed that all members present had received their copies of the Annual Report and Financial statements well in advance. He further informed the house that two notices had been received for discussion during the AGM. Additionally, one query related to the Auditor's Report was received after the stipulated deadline mentioned in the AGM notice.

**The meeting proceeded as per the pre-circulated agenda.**

**2. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 62nd AGM**

The minutes of the 62<sup>nd</sup> Annual General Meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2023 at IIMM NHQ, CBD Belapur, Navi Mumbai, were placed before the house for confirmation.

- **Resolution: The minutes were unanimously approved.**

**3. Adoption of Audited Financial Statements for FY 2023-24**

The National President invited National Secretary & Treasurer Mr. R. K. Rastogi to present the audited financials.

Mr. Rastogi presented key highlights of the Income & Expenditure Account and the Balance Sheet as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024. He noted that the accounts had already been placed before the 199th NC Meeting held on 22nd September 2024 and were duly approved (199.06) after deliberation.

He confirmed that the overall financial position of the Institute is satisfactory and requested the house to adopt the same.

#### **4. Appointment of Auditors for FY 2024–25**

The National President proposed the reappointment of M/s. Chandabhoy & Jassoobhoy (C&J) as statutory auditors. He informed that their revised remuneration request was ₹ 7.00 lakhs, up from the current ₹ 6.25 lakhs + out-of-pocket expenses.

After discussion, it was agreed to approve ₹ 6.75 lakhs as remuneration.

#### **5. Other Points Discussed**

##### **(a) Clarification on Write-off Amount**

Mr. P. K. Mehrotra (Member Dehradun, formerly Haridwar Branch) inquired about the write-off of ₹ 4.00 lakhs mentioned in auditor's note 6(h). Though the query was received late (**9<sup>th</sup> November, 10:40 PM**) and the member was not present, the matter was taken up to maintain transparency.

- ₹ 80,000 was approved in the Bhiwandi NC.
- ₹ 3,20,000 was written off by branches and approved by their respective Ecs.

**Resolution: The explanation was accepted by the house.**

##### **(b) Query by Mr. Ajay Atwe (Indore Branch)**

Mr. Ajay Atwe, a member from the Indore Branch and present at the AGM, submitted a notice inquiring whether the complaint filed by Immediate Past President (IPP) Mr. H K Sharma with the Charity Commissioner, without prior discussion in any Institute Forum, constitutes an act of indiscipline and what action is proposed by the Institute.

The matter was duly deliberated by the house. It was unanimously agreed that initiating such a complaint without internal discussion or approval does constitute an act of indiscipline.

**Resolution:**

**Since the matter is sub judice and currently pending before the Charity Commissioner, the house resolved that it is appropriate to await the official judgment before considering any further course of action.**

##### **(c) Non-Submission of Reports by Delegates**

Mr. Uday Bhanu (Member, Visakhapatnam Branch) Present at the AGM submitted a notice a concern regarding delegates who attended international events but failed to submit reports to the National Council despite repeated reminders.

**The house viewed non-submission of reports seriously. It was resolved that in such cases, the expenses may not be allowed and must be recovered from the concerned delegates.**


**A suggestion to recover the amount from respective branches was proposed but rejected by the house.**

**Report on the Audit of Financial Statements**

**OPINION**

1. We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of Indian Institute of Materials Management ("the Institute") which comprises of the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2025, Income & Expenditure Account for the year then ended and notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as the "Financial Statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements gives a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the institute and surplus for the year ended on that date.

**BASIS FOR OPINION**

2. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) generally accepted in India. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the institute in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

**Emphasis of Matter**

3. We invite your attention to following matters in the notes to the financial statements:
4. (a) As stated in note no. 7 (a & b) of Schedule E, Inter branch and other balances are subject to confirmation, reconciliation and consequential adjustments, if any;
- (b) As stated in note no. 8 of Schedule E, 51 branches and headquarter are considered in consolidation of financials for the year under audit. Remaining 2 branches are not included in the consolidated financials.
- (c) As stated in note no. 10, the Institute has received tax demands for various assessment years and preferred appeal against the respective orders.





(d) As stated in note no. 11 of Schedule E, the institute had received income tax refund (alongwith interest, if any) aggregating to Rs. 1,36,53,548/- (P.Y. 90,84,513/-) and the same has been adjusted against income Tax/ TDS paid on adhoc basis due to non-availability of branch wise details of TDS etc.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matters.

### **MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

5. The Board of Trustees of the Institute are responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the institute in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the institute and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies, making judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

The Board of Trustees is also responsible for overseeing the Institute's financial reporting process.

### **AUDITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

6. Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

1. No provision of taxation has been made in the accounts in view of the exemption available to the Institute under the Income Tax Act 1961.



7. (a) Inter Branch balances are subject to confirmation, reconciliation and subsequent adjustments, if any. Management as a measure of prudence made provision for old outstanding amount for items outstanding upto 31.03.2015 and in meanwhile try to reconcile old and new pending items. Net balance of Inter Branch accounts (after provision of Rs.28,81,541/- made during earlier year) as on 31.03.2025 is Rs.3199205/- (P.Y. 3001659/-) The same is subject to reconciliation and subsequent adjustments, if any

(b) Balance of Loans, Advances & Deposits, Advance for office premises, other loans & advances for office Premises, other liabilities, Some of the items of Fixed Assets, TDS receivable etc. of the Institute and fixed deposits with bank for few branches are subject to confirmation, reconciliations and subsequent adjustments, if any.

8. During the year, 51 branches (Excluding NHQ) are included as against 48 branches during the previous year.  
In the view of above audited figures of current year are strictly not comparable with that of previous years.

9. The Institute has entered into MOU with Madhya Pradesh Bhopal Open University (MPBOU) on 05.10.2002. As per MOU, the Institute was to receive prorata share in respect of fresh admission and subsequent admission to next year from MPBOU and had received the same till academic year 2009-10. Thereafter admission were stopped due to non release of IIMM prorata share. The students who have taken admission in academic session 2009-10 were to move on to next year and so on. IIMM prorata share money kept on accumulating, amounting to Rs. 43.41 lakhs (approx) including security money till 2012. The amount receivable is contingent. The Institute has filed legal suit (Case no. FA 596/2017) against MPBOU in Jabalpur High Court on 11.08.2017, as verdict from Bhopal Session Court was given in favour of MPBOU. The matter is at the initial stage.

10. (a) The Institute has received notice u/s 274 read with section 270A alongwith order u/s 144 and notice of demand u/s 166 determining tax demand of Rs. 164,68,768/- for AY 2018-19. The Institute has paid 20% tax amounting to Rs. 32,93,754/- under protest and filed an Appeal.

(b) The Institute has received an intimation u/s 143 (1) for Assessment year 2020-21 on 30.11.2021 for tax payment demand of Rs. 4,03,23,600/- by disallowing exemption of section 11 & 12 of Income Tax Act. The Institute has filed an Appeal against the intimation / order on 30.12.2021, which has gone against the Institute. Then the Institute filed Condonation for delay in filing Form 10B. Subsequent to the year end, the delay in filing Form 10B has been condoned by CIT (Exemption) vide its order dated 04.07.2024.

(c) The Institute has received a communication dated 09.02.2023 for proposed adjustment u/s 143 (1) (a) for Assessment year 2022-23 for Rs. 1,36,33,234/- for non filing of Form 10 within the due date. Form 10 was immediately filed on the portal and also an application for condonation in delay of filing Form 10 is filed with the CIT (E)

11. The Institute had received income tax refund (alongwith interest, if any) aggregating to Rs. 1,36,53,548/- (P.Y. 90,84,613/-) and the same has been adjusted against Income Tax/ TDS paid on adhoc basis due to non-availability of branch wise details of TDS etc.
